1. General description

The 74HC4052; 74HCT4052 is a dual single-pole quad-throw analog switch (2x SP4T) suitable for use in analog or digital 4:1 multiplexer/demultiplexer applications. Each switch features four independent inputs/outputs (nY0, nY1, nY2 and nY3) and a common input/output (nZ). A digital enable input ($\bar{E}$) and two digital select inputs (S0 and S1) are common to both switches. When $\bar{E}$ is HIGH, the switches are turned off. Inputs include clamp diodes. This enables the use of current limiting resistors to interface inputs to voltages in excess of V_{CC} .

2. Features and benefits

- Wide analog input voltage range from -5 V to $+5\text{ V}$
- Low ON resistance:
 - ◆ $80\ \Omega$ (typical) at $V_{CC} - V_{EE} = 4.5\text{ V}$
 - ◆ $70\ \Omega$ (typical) at $V_{CC} - V_{EE} = 6.0\text{ V}$
 - ◆ $60\ \Omega$ (typical) at $V_{CC} - V_{EE} = 9.0\text{ V}$
- Logic level translation: to enable 5 V logic to communicate with $\pm 5\text{ V}$ analog signals
- Typical 'break before make' built-in
- Complies with JEDEC standard no. 7A
- Input levels:
 - ◆ For 74HC4052: CMOS level
 - ◆ For 74HCT4052: TTL level
- ESD protection:
 - ◆ HBM JESD22-A114F exceeds 2000 V
 - ◆ MM JESD22-A115-A exceeds 200 V
 - ◆ CDM JESD22-C101E exceeds 1000 V

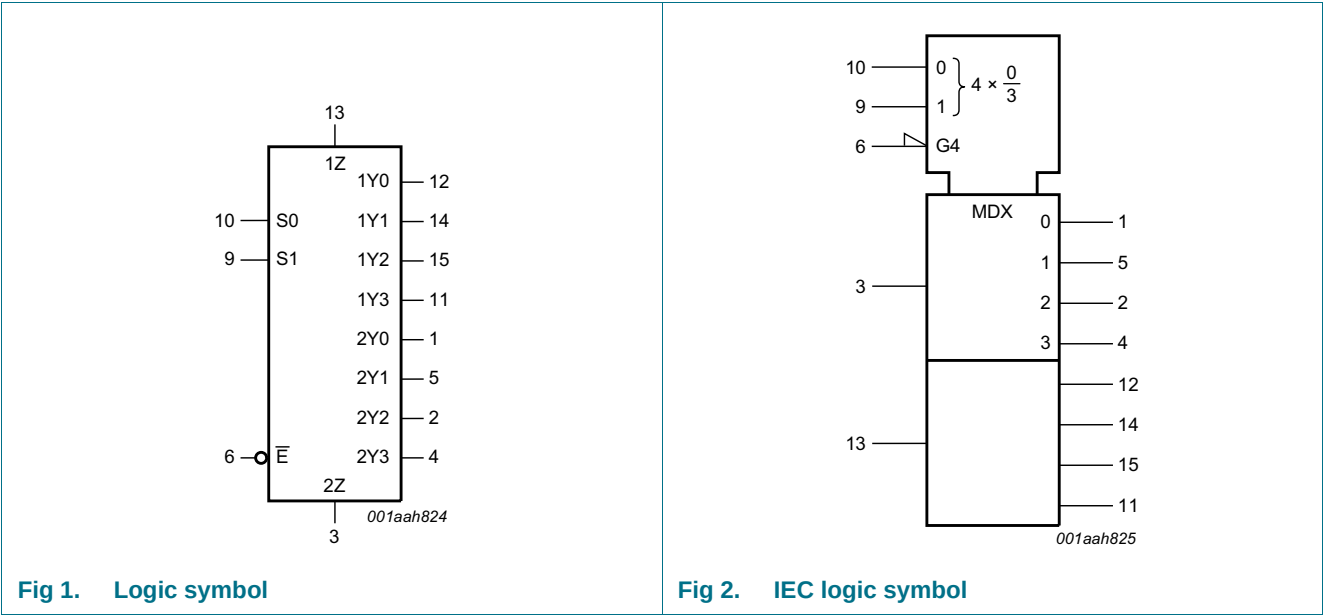

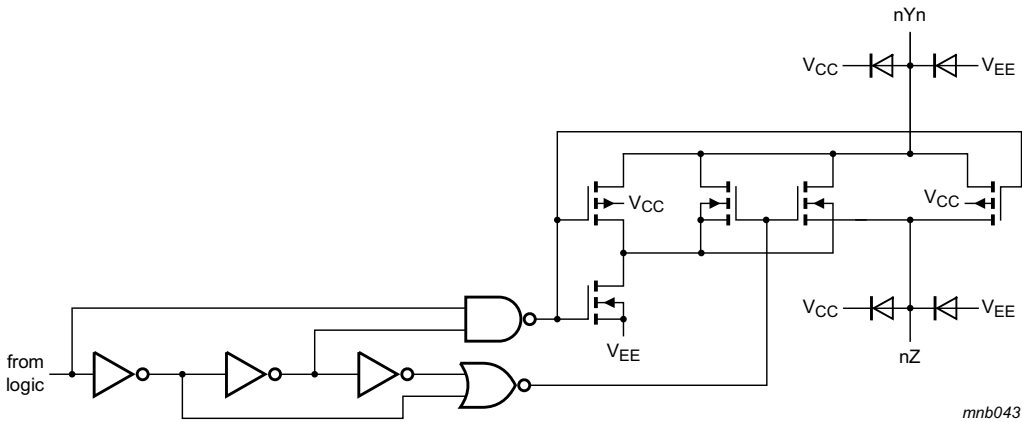


Fig 3. Schematic diagram (one switch)

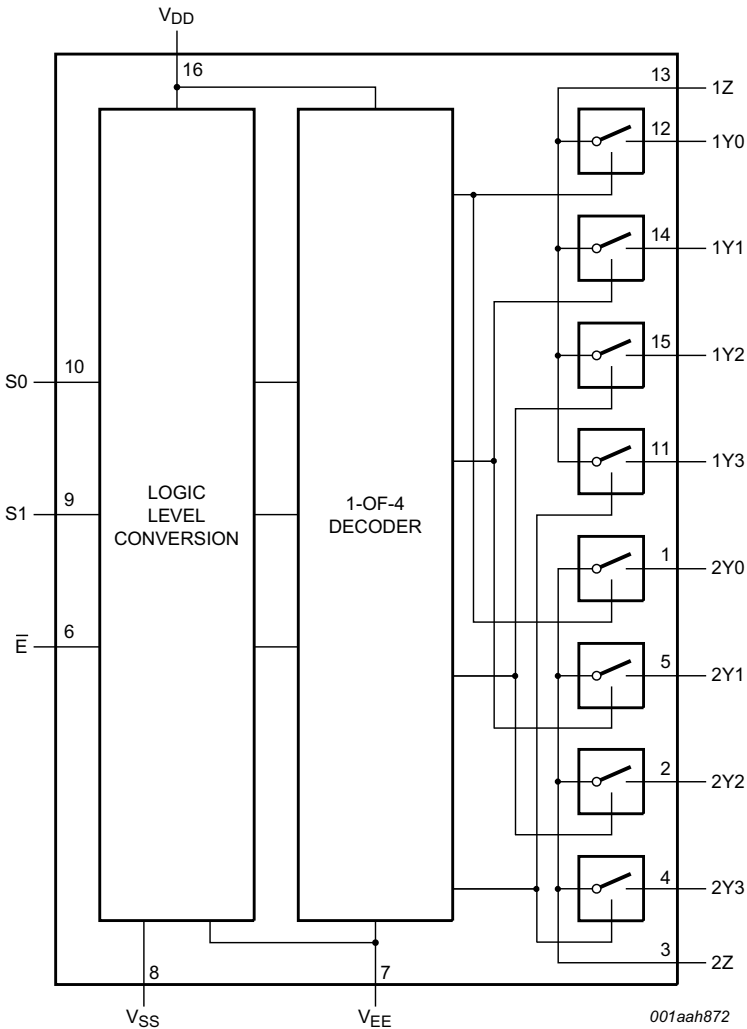
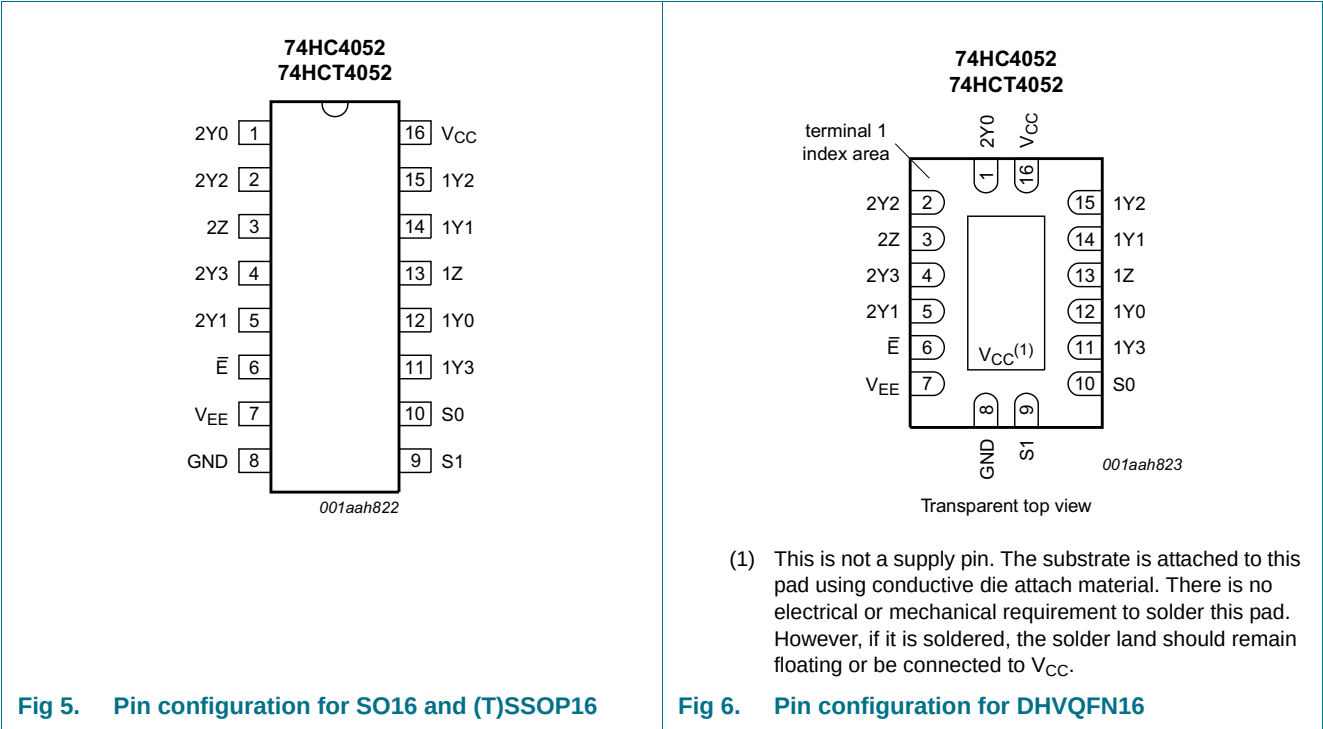


Fig 4. Functional diagram

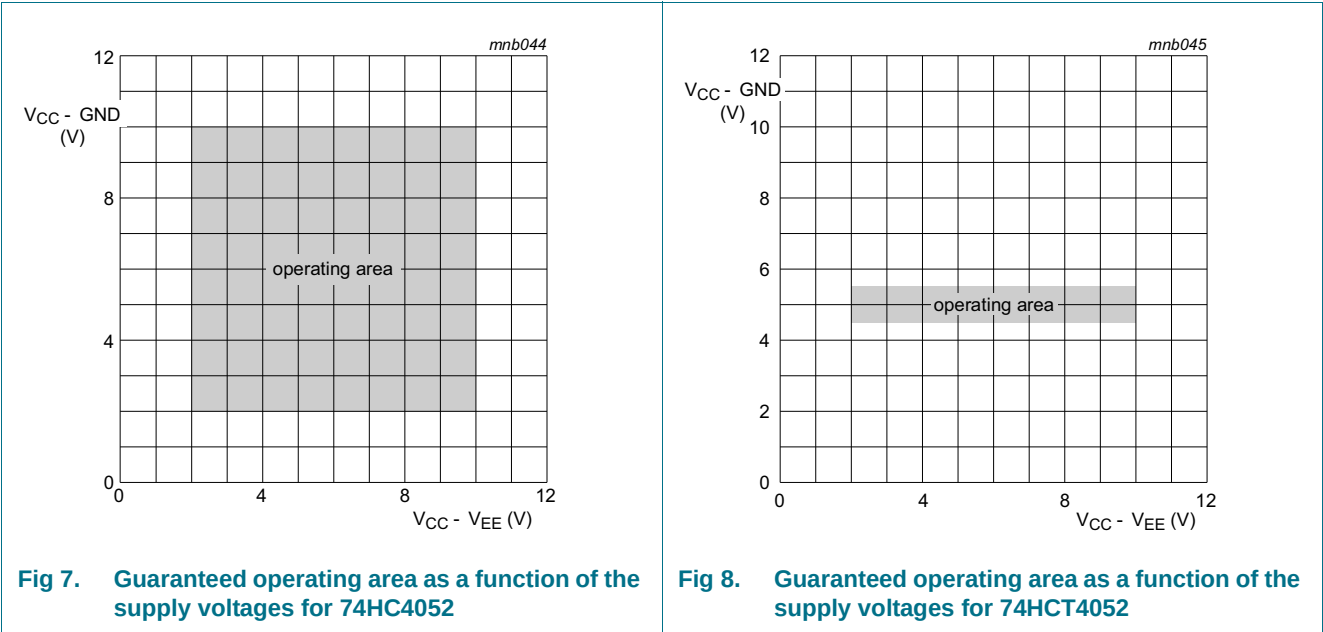

- [1] To avoid drawing V_{CC} current out of pins nZ, when switch current flows in pins nYn, the voltage drop across the bidirectional switch must not exceed 0.4 V. If the switch current flows into pins nZ, no V_{CC} current will flow out of pins nYn. In this case there is no limit for the voltage drop across the switch, but the voltages at pins nYn and nZ may not exceed V_{CC} or V_{EE} .
- [2] For SO16 packages: above 70 °C the value of P_{tot} derates linearly with 8 mW/K.
For SSOP16 and TSSOP16 packages: above 60 °C the value of P_{tot} derates linearly with 5.5 mW/K.
For DHVQFN16 packages: above 60 °C the value of P_{tot} derates linearly with 4.5 mW/K.

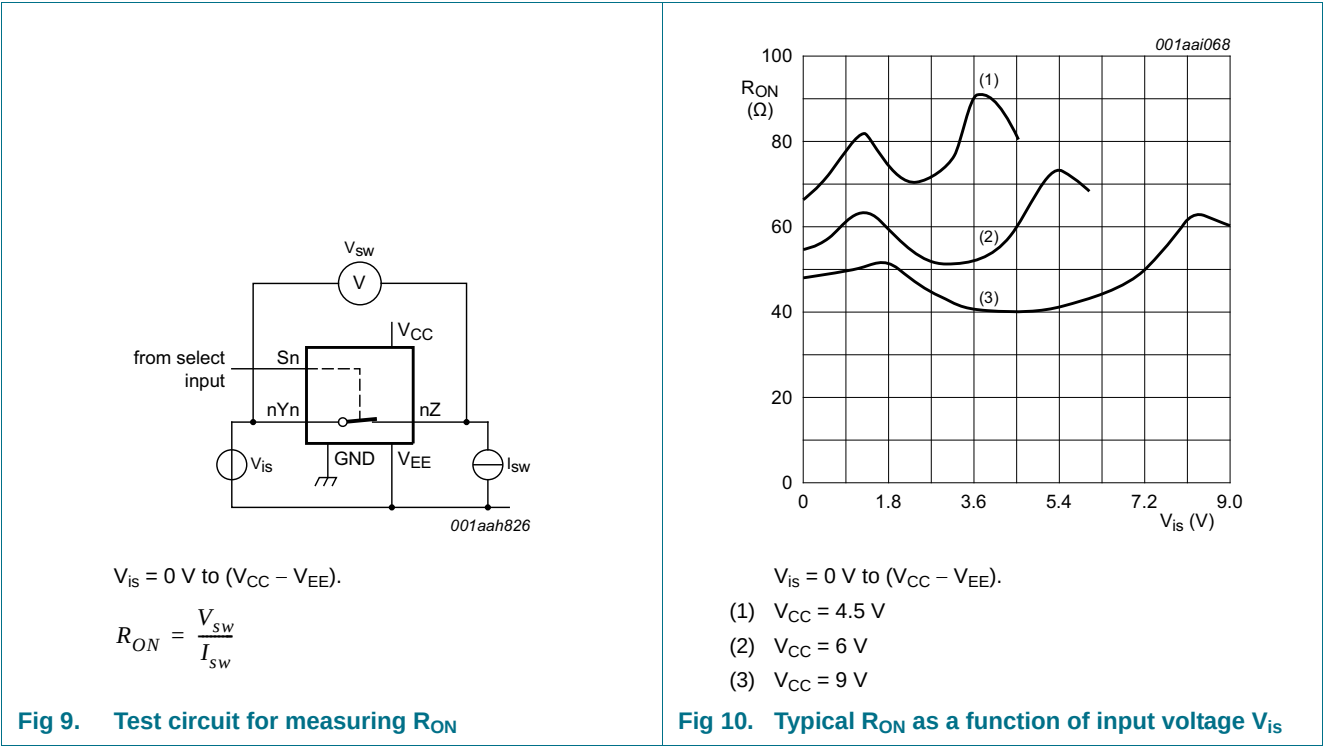

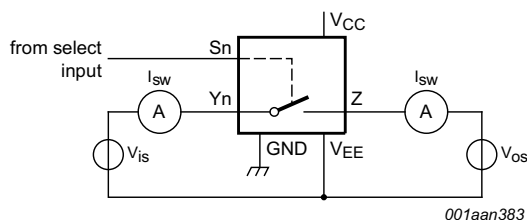
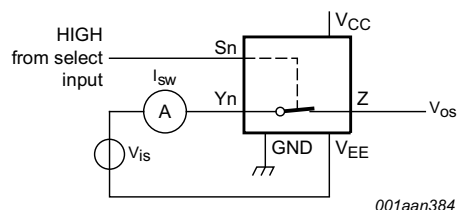

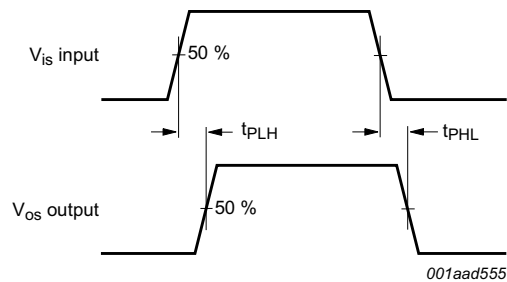

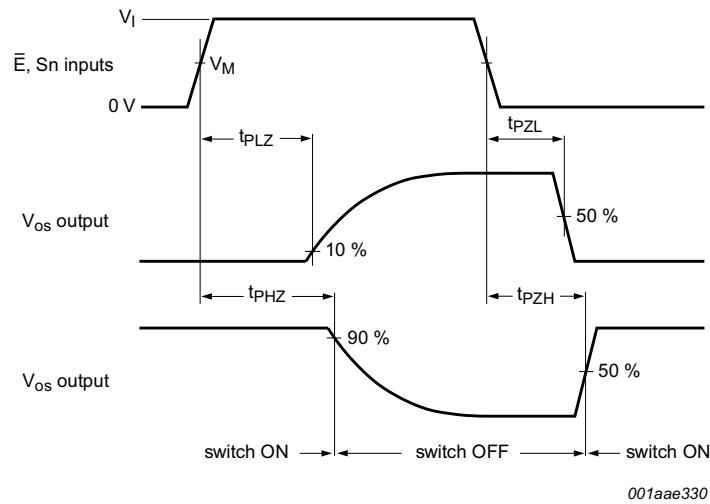

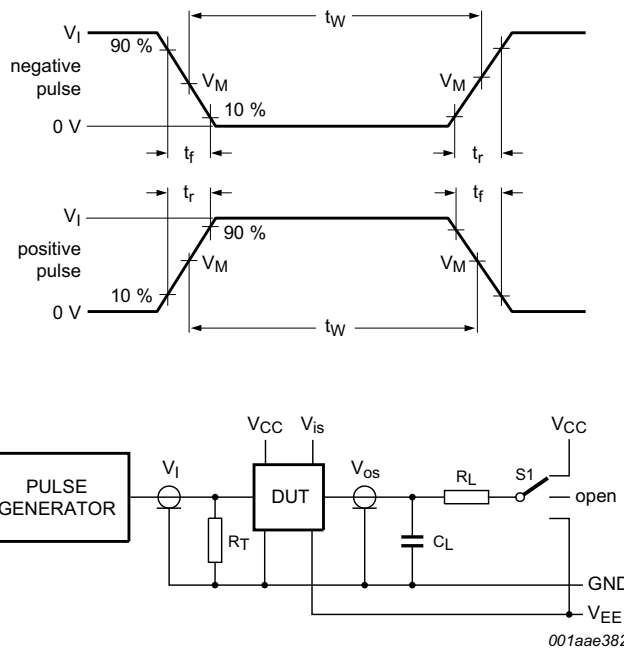

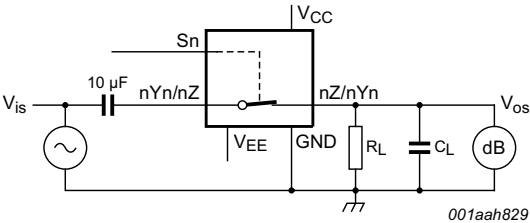
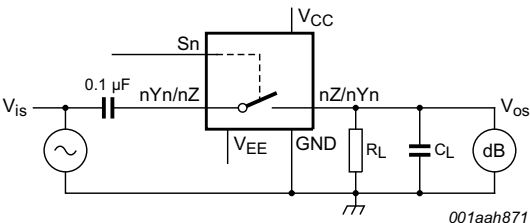
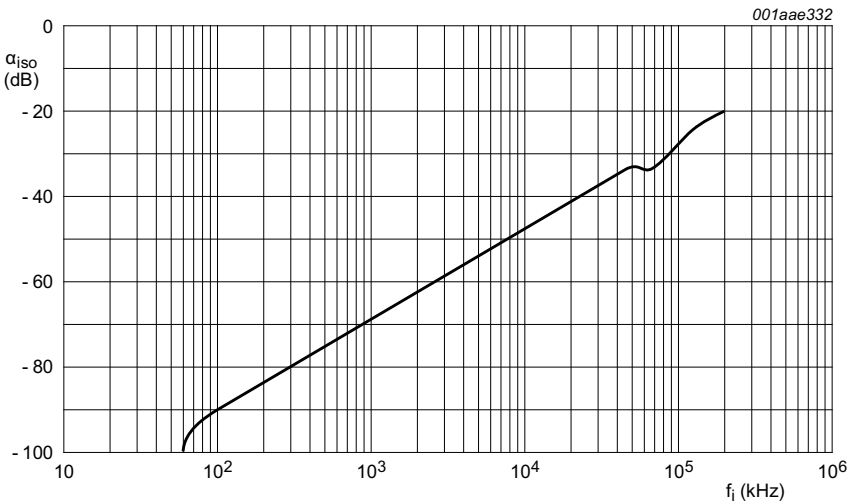


Fig 16. Test circuit for measuring sine-wave distortion

Fig 17. Test circuit for measuring isolation (OFF-state)

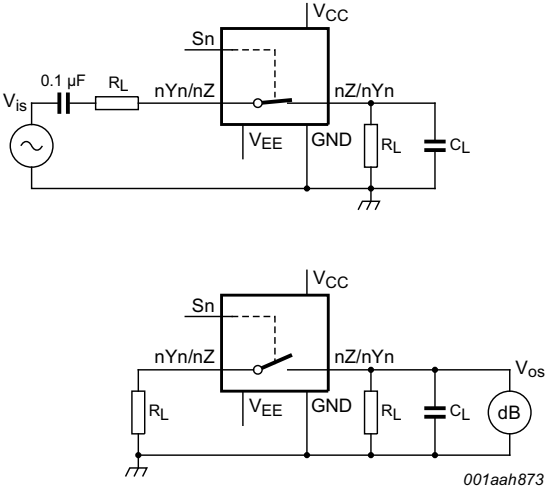


Fig 18. Test circuits for measuring crosstalk between any two switches/multiplexers

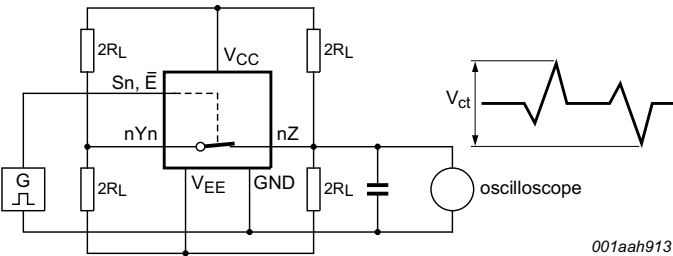
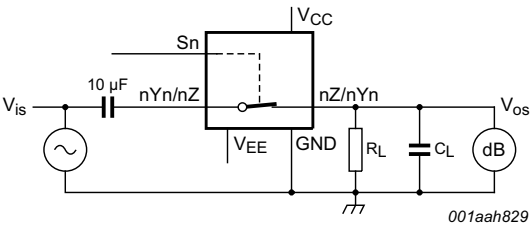
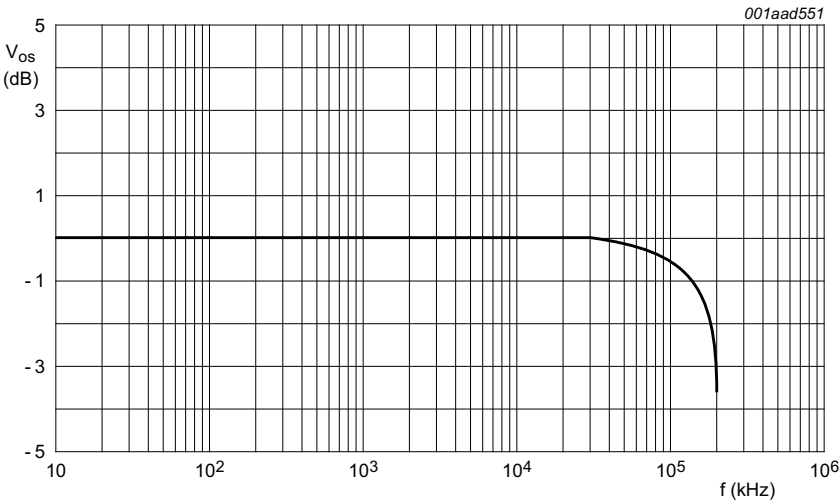


Fig 19. Test circuit for measuring crosstalk between control input and any switch

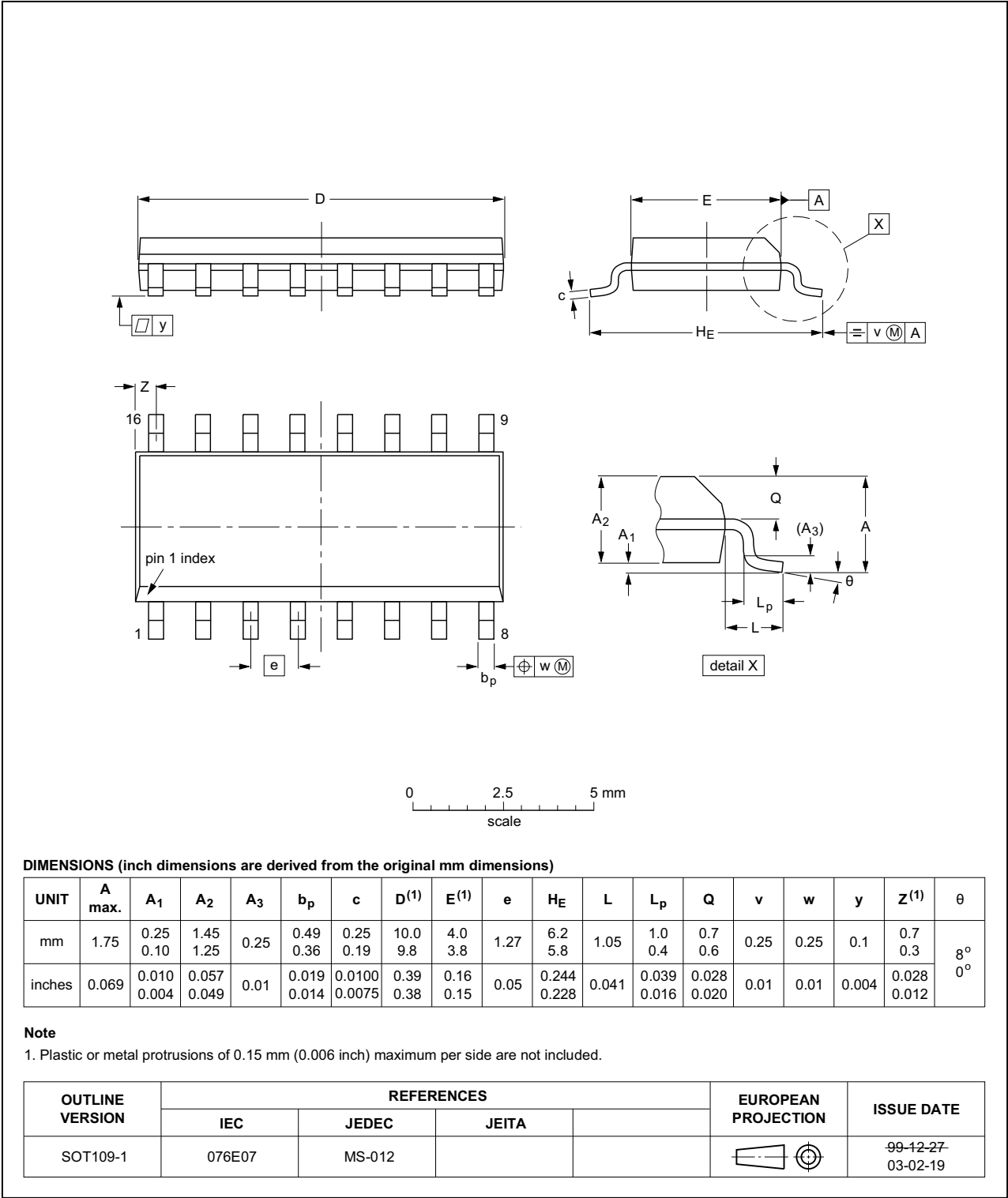


Fig 21. Package outline SOT109-1 (SO16)

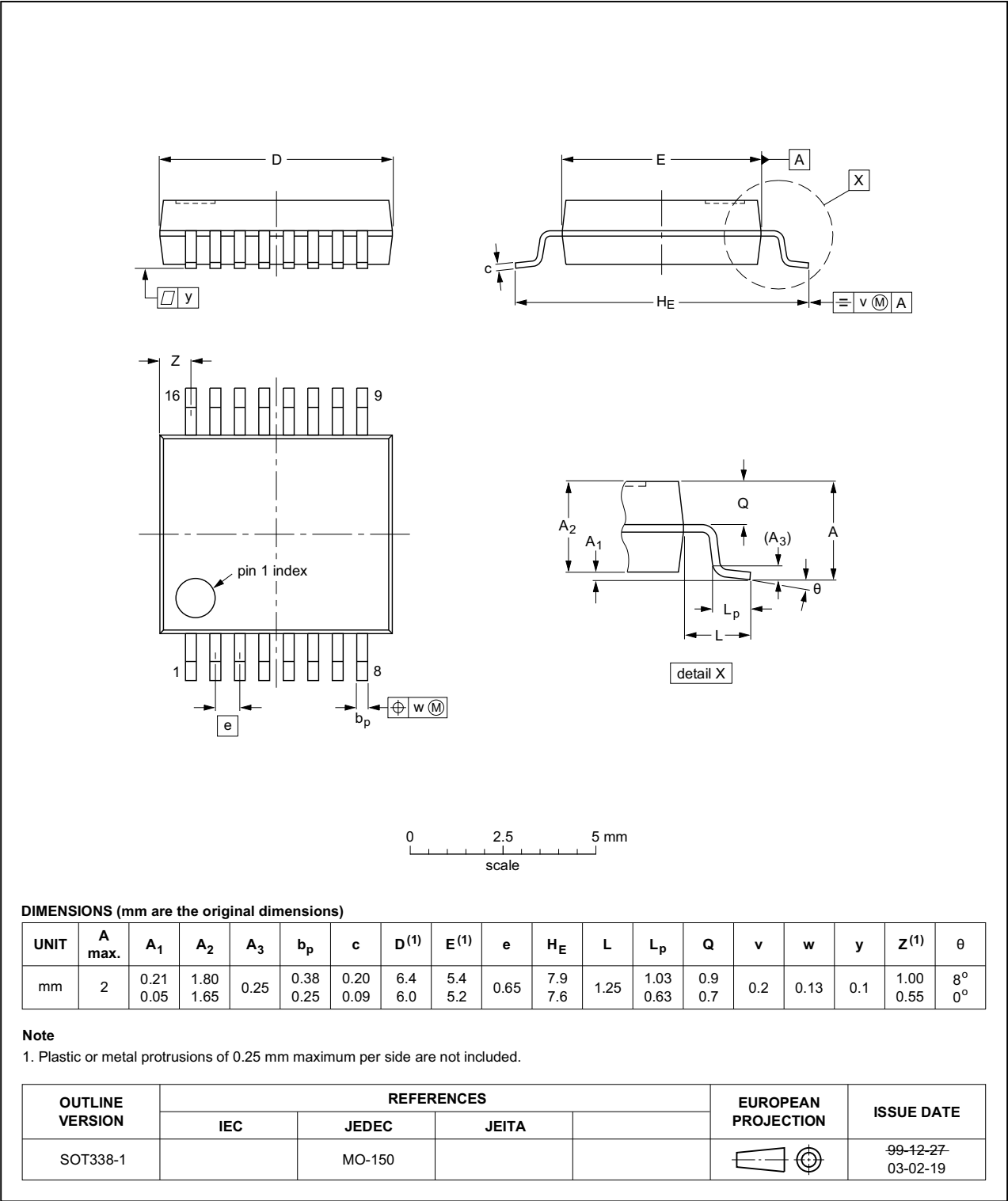


Fig 22. Package outline SOT338-1 (SSOP16)

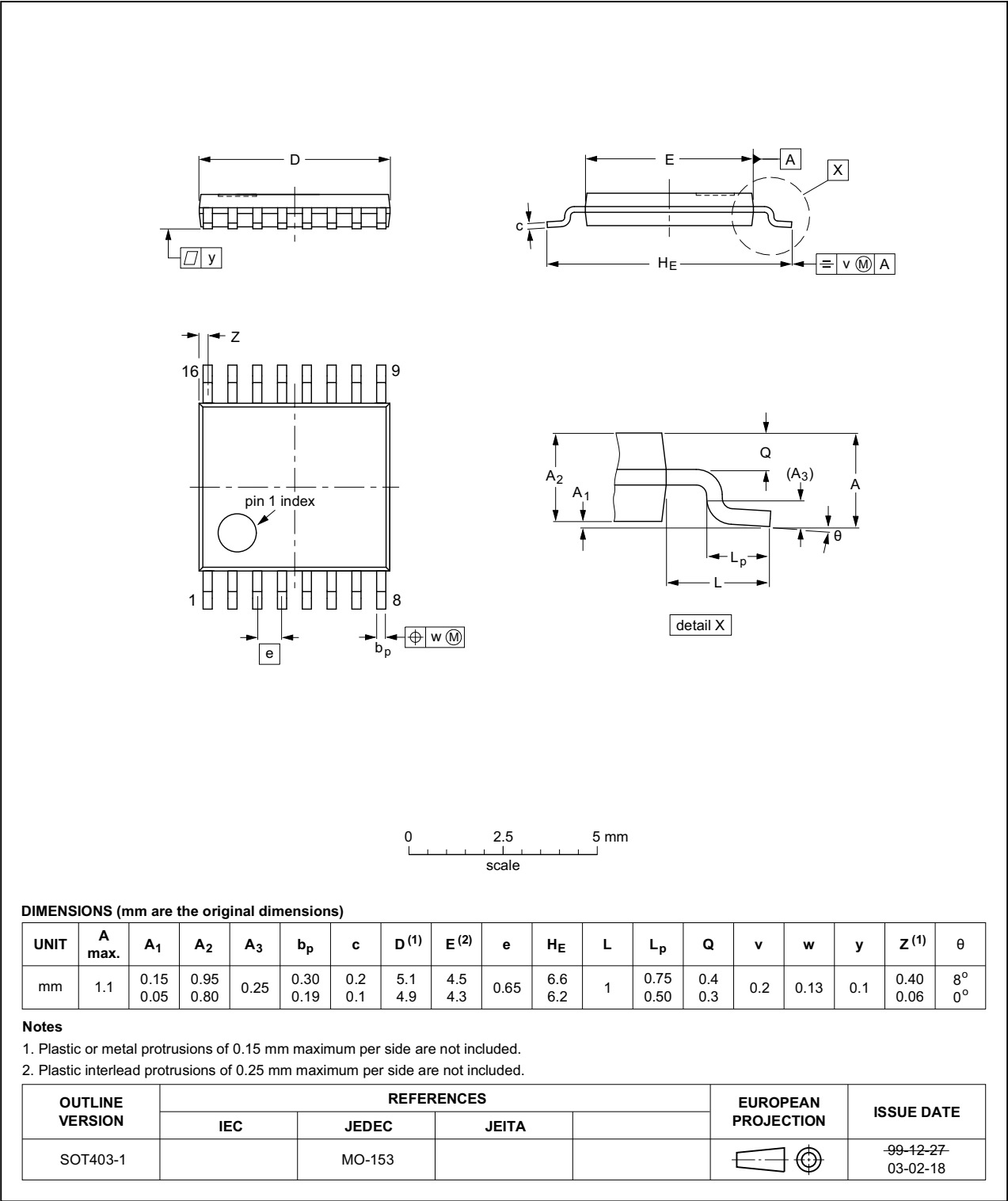


Fig 23. Package outline SOT403-1 (TSSOP16)

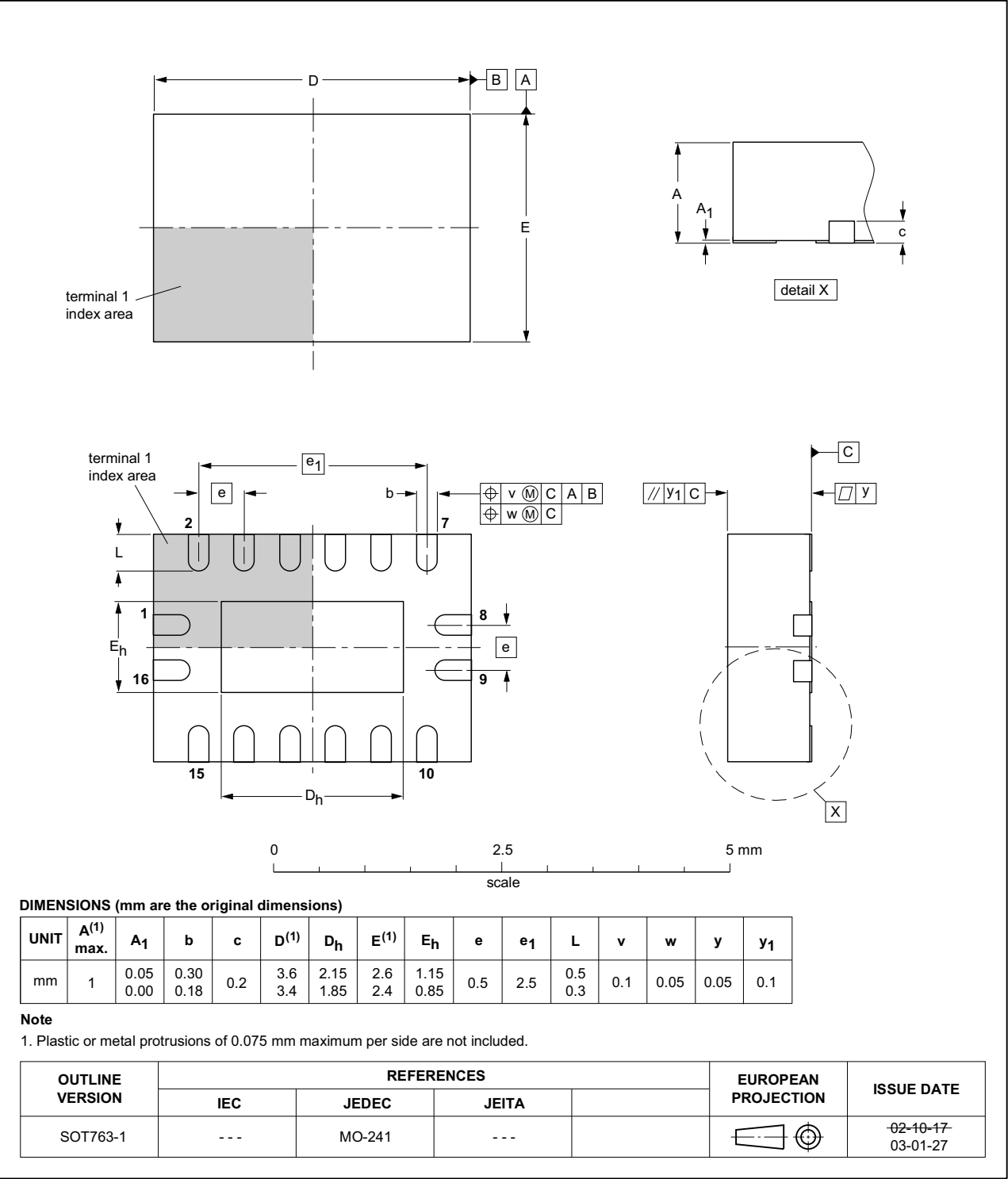


Fig 24. Package outline SOT763-1 (DHVQFN16)
